



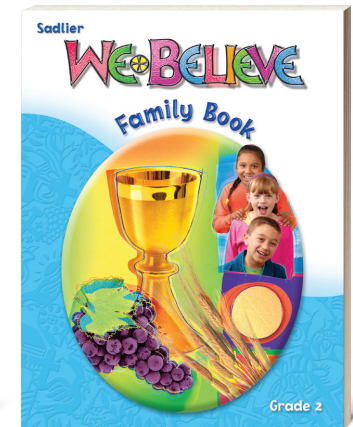
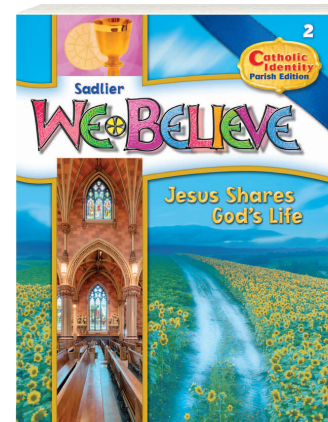

Dear Catechetical Leader,

This At-Home Model is designed to guide parents that are primarily responsible for the catechesis of their children at home and who are using the *We Believe Catholic Identity Edition* Student Text and the *We Believe Family Book* as catechetical materials. This model is especially helpful for parents and families who have scheduling difficulties or extenuating circumstances such as a homebound child. This supplement identifies the four chapters in each grade where the Catholic Identity Retreats have been included, as well as simple directions for these prayerful experiences. The four retreat themes are related to the Four Pillars of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* – CREED, LITURGY & SACRAMENTS, MORALITY, and PRAYER. Using the *We Believe Family Book* and the additional information provided in this supplement incorporating the Catholic Identity Retreats, the parent or other family member is able to work together with the child. The *Family Book* gives clear directions, help, and suggestions to the adult who is guiding the experience with the child using the *We Believe* Student Text. Many parishes specify and request some accountability from the family demonstrating that the sessions have been completed. Options for accountability are included within this document.

Orientation Session	<p>In September, invite parents who will be doing at-home catechesis to an orientation session.</p> <p>Arrange to meet individually with parents who cannot attend the orientation session.</p>	<p>During the session:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask parents to affirm their commitment to the faith development of their children. • Go through the Family Book with them and highlight the three-step process, the faith words, and the importance of doing the activities. • Show parents the wealth of resources on the website both for their own learning and for evaluations from them. A Family or Child Portfolio	Explain the portfolio as a creative project that may include photographs of the family engaged in a session or doing an activity, a completed lesson(s) that was particularly interesting, reflections, prayers, and drawings or journal entries about a Catholic belief that is important to the family. These could be sent in or dropped off in an envelope or folder at the completion of a unit, semester, or year.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is the most engaging option and will give assessment of both cognitive and affective faith development. • It is important to return the portfolios to the parents with positive feedback.
